

Guide to your pet's worry-free wardrobe

- Make sure your pet's costume fits well. It should be loose enough for them to move easily, but snug enough to prevent tripping.
- Steer clear of any costume accessories that cover their ears, mouth, or eyes. Always keep these areas free of obstructions.
- Avoid costumes that might make your pet overheat.
- If you're heading out with your pet, keep them on a secure leash with up-to-date tags. Adding reflective gear is also a good idea to help keep them visible in the dark.
- Check their outfit for any small parts like buttons, beads, or tassels that they could chew or swallow. Remove or secure these items before dressing them up.
- Avoid hair dye or paint that your pet could lick, as some may be toxic if ingested.

Remember: Don't force your pet into a costume (no matter how cute!) and always watch for signs of distress or anxiety in your furry family member.
